Helen wrote this lovely song as a thank-you gift to her host after she spent a delightful period of time as a house guest at the Henderson home. As was often the case with Helen Desha Beamer, she wrote a companion song for the lady of the house as well as for the man of the house – Kimo. The companion song is "Moani-ke-'ala" – the name given to the Henderson family home. It is a song rarely heard these days and hasn't been recorded for years. But it certainly should be!
